If you have any Covid-19 symptoms or feel unwell, please do not visit our hospital






Patients must wait until they have a negative swab result before they can have visitors.

This should take 24 hours.

You may NOT visit without a face covering – please bring & wear your own or you can get one from the hospital main entrance if necessary

Wash hands or use sanitising gel on entering and leaving the ward






Please sign in on entry to the ward

Bed number even

or side room 3.30 - 4pm



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No more than one visitor must be designated to visit for the entire time that the patient is at the hospital.

This is to reduce the risk of cross-infection.

Anyone else can contact via video messaging. Our wards have iPads & phones available for this purpose if necessary.

Do not eat or drink whilst visiting the ward





You cannot use the toilet on the ward. Public toilets are available elsewhere in the hospital

Do not sit on beds. Chairs are provided
